19	Informational Items. Discussion of Articles
20	of Incorporation.
21	MS. ELHASAN: I have on the agenda Discussion
22	of the Articles of Incorporation. I'm just going to
23	sort of frame my issues very broadly, and then I'd like
24	to talk to Commission Counsel a little bit further about
25	that in a couple weeks to come because, frankly, I have



- 1 to get to a 2:00 meeting.
- 2 So the last time I appeared before you we
- 3 talked about the Commission reaching out to me and
- 4 indicating, Commission Counsel saying, oh, well, there's
- 5 Articles of Incorporation that we have that are
- 6 different than the ones that are posted. And I directed
- 7 this Board to acknowledge that, and I further indicated
- 8 that I didn't have a final or signed copy of the
- 9 articles.
- 10 I came to learn over the course of the last
- 11 couple weeks that there was quite the conversation
- 12 between Commission Counsel, our office, and the
- 13 Administrative Office at the time indicating that
- 14 procedurally this Board doesn't adopt resolutions of the
- 15 Commission, and the Commission doesn't unilaterally make
- 16 decisions to amend the Articles of Incorporation and
- 17 then enforce them on this Board to accept or pass a
- 18 resolution that would, in fact, accept those articles.
- 19 We referred to a step-by-step process about
- 20 how we can effectuate changes and amend the Articles of
- 21 Incorporation.
- I know that there was some disagreement. I
- 23 can see Felicia moving around in her chair. There was
- 24 obviously -- and, again, I'm not going to get into an
- 25 argument on the record right now and go back and forth,



- 1 I'd much rather deal with that in a side bar
- 2 conversation. Certainly there was disagreement about
- 3 how to procedurally effectuate those changes. It was
- 4 not acknowledged or accepted by Commission at the time,
- 5 and so I'd like to look further into those issues before
- 6 I ask this body to accept those articles.
- 7 They have not been filed by the State for the
- 8 reasons that I just noted. We don't believe it was
- 9 properly -- that it properly went through the process
- 10 that this body, which is a separate entity, gets to
- 11 proceed on amending those articles. Again, I'm not
- 12 against the amendment, I'm against the process that was
- 13 attempted to be effectuated to change the Articles of
- 14 Incorporation, and I don't think anybody disagrees that
- 15 the articles can be changed, but those articles have to
- 16 be signed by the secretary, and they have to be filed by
- 17 the secretary of this body. And so that's why they were
- 18 never finalized, that's why they were never approved,
- 19 and that's why they were never filed. So I think we
- 20 have to go through whatever that process is to make
- 21 those changes. And, like I indicated, I'm not going to
- 22 go through a back-and-forth right now simply because I
- 23 don't have time, but I'm happy to talk to Commission
- 24 Counsel to see how we can amicably resolve this issue.
- 25 CHAIRPERSON DeHART: And, quite honestly, I



- 1 don't think this Board is interested in seeing the
- 2 discourse between you and Commission Counsel.
- 3 MS. ELHASAN: And there's no discourse.
- 4 MS. JOHNSON: But if I could add some history,
- 5 at the time that the articles were adopted in, I believe
- 6 it was 2012, there was a disagreement regarding adding
- 7 the auditor in the audit function, so we actually had a
- 8 substantive disagreement at that time. It wasn't about
- 9 procedure at that time, it was a substantive
- 10 disagreement that we had, and we wanted -- the
- 11 Commission desired to have some procurement language in
- 12 there, and we couldn't substantively agree, so it was
- 13 never a procedural issue, and I have no issues having
- 14 that procedural discussion, but I'm looking at the
- 15 statute, and it says that the Articles -- amendments may
- 16 be made to the Articles of Incorporation if adopted by
- 17 the legislative body of each incorporating unit.
- MS. ELHASAN: I agree.
- MS. JOHNSON: So --
- 20 MS. ELHASAN: If adopted, not amended by the
- 21 governing body, this body -- okay -- but let me address
- 22 that on the record -- so this body makes the amendment,
- 23 proposes the amendment, passes a resolution to amend the
- 24 articles, and submits that resolution to the Commission
- 25 to approve. I agree with the statute.



- 1 MS. JOHNSON: As long as we find that language
- in this statute, we'll agree. If we don't, I'll tell
- 3 you the Commissioners were prepared to amend the
- 4 articles again and then make sure they're filed
- 5 themselves because that was again a function of the
- 6 Administration, but we'll have that discussion, I just
- 7 never read that procedure in the actual statute.
- 8 MS. ELHASAN: Yeah, but what you just read is
- 9 exactly what I just said, and, actually, they cannot be
- 10 filed by the Commission because the secretary of this
- 11 body would have to sign off on it and, actually, you
- 12 would have to file it. The State of Michigan would not
- 13 allow the filing of the articles because this body is a
- 14 separate entity. But, again, we are not against that,
- 15 we are not against the amendment, but you may recall the
- 16 last time I was here I said we're not against the
- 17 Auditor General looking at -- that is already available,
- 18 you don't have to include it in the articles to impose
- 19 those sort of requirements on this body, but we at least
- 20 recognize that. But, again, we'll have that
- 21 conversation.
- 22 CHAIRPERSON DeHART: Okay. Thank you both for
- 23 the information, and that is simply an informational
- 24 item, so there's no action to be taken by this body
- 25 question.



- 1 Question?
- 2 MR. VASLO: Are we still under that Judge
- 3 Kenny --
- 4 CHAIRPERSON DeHART: Directive?
- 5 MR. VASLO: -- directive or is that done?
- 6 CHAIRPERSON DeHART: That is done because --
- 7 MS. ELHASAN: If Felicia knows, I know.
- 8 CHAIRPERSON DeHART: Auditor General's report
- 9 has been released.
- MS. ELHASAN: Well, the report has been
- 11 released, but discussions have not been -- you know, I
- 12 don't think his order that released those records
- 13 applies so broadly to have candid discussions and
- 14 conversations about the actual proceedings. So I would
- 15 err on the side of caution and not have those
- 16 discussions.
- 17 CHAIRPERSON DeHART: Okay.
- 18 MR. VASLO: I don't like that, you know, we're
- 19 government, we should be able to have any kind of
- 20 discussion we want.
- MS. ELHASAN: I know, but we're also bound by
- 22 Judge's orders.
- MR. VASLO: How long do you think that's going
- 24 to go on?
- MS. ELHASAN: I have no idea.



1	MS. JOHNSON: Probably forever. I mean at
2	this point there have been several FOIA requests that
3	the County's had to respond to, we've had litigation.
4	The Judge has amended the order, as you know, to allow
5	at least the release of the report. He's indicated he's
6	not going back to revisit it. We have some concerns
7	because he only addressed portions and not other items,
8	but if he's not going to go back to address it, I don't
9	know how you then will ever be allowed to have
10	discussions or look at every document that's out there.
11	MS. ELHASAN: Yeah, and, also, maybe at some
12	point the one-man grand jury statute provides for a
13	20-year, you know, reservation of the evidence or the
14	documents or the information or the testimony that is
15	utilized by the one-man grand juror to make decisions.
16	But as it relates to having discussions, I presume, I
17	can only presume, because one-man grand jury statue is
18	very limited in its use in the State of Michigan and
19	otherwise, but I would presume that when there's
20	finality to and complete adjudication of the matter,
21	then there could be a little bit more flexibility in
22	discussion. But that does not mean that all documents
23	and evidence would be released.
24	MR. VASLO: No, we were ordered to, you know,
25	collect up all of our e-mails and, you know, all that is



- 1 apparently still on, and it seems ridiculous.
- 2 CHAIRPERSON DeHART: Okay. Hearing nothing
- 3 else, is there any Public Discussion?
- 4 MR. SAROS: I would like to make a Public
- 5 Comment. You referred to something earlier, just for
- 6 the record about Frank Vaslo. He was vociferous in his
- 7 desire to keep those cells from being destroyed and,
- 8 also, have been receiving some nice compliments for
- 9 that, but this whole body made I think some moves during
- 10 that time that really has saved this county an awful lot
- of money by not allowing certain things to be destroyed,
- 12 so I want to put that in the record.
- 13 CHAIRPERSON DeHART: Zenna, you want to
- 14 collect these back, correct?
- MS. ELHASAN: Yes, please.
- 16 CHAIRPERSON DeHART: Okay. Is there a motion
- 17 to adjourn?
- 18 MR. HOFFMAN: Madam Chair, don't we have a
- 19 meeting --
- 20 CHAIRPERSON DeHART: Yes. Seeing as there are
- 21 currently no agenda items for our next regularly
