Dated February 2, 2026 (received February 3rd) requesting Commission approval of a one-year limited-use agreement between the Charter County of Wayne and the U.S. Marshals Service not to exceed \$292,000, at a rate of \$400 per day per minor, to house two minors in the Juvenile Detention Facility; the Office of Corporation Counsel advises that the minors are under indictment and in federal custody for alleged crimes that occurred in Wayne County; the term is from February 1, 2026 through January 31, 2027; the revenue will be deposited into Account No. 29201 356010 6530110 (HHVS JDF Operations). ## RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, Black History Month calls upon all levels of government to confront historic and ongoing inequities that disproportionately harm Black communities, including inequities in health, environmental safety, and consumer protection; and

WHEREAS, women are routinely exposed to carcinogens and toxic chemicals due to insufficient regulation of hair and beauty products marketed specifically to them; and

WHEREAS, historically, hair and beauty products used by women have not been subject to rigorous monitoring or meaningful regulatory oversight despite frequent and long-term use beginning at young ages; and

WHEREAS, a 2025 Consumer Reports study found that synthetic braiding hair brands marketed to Black women contained lead, as well as carcinogens and toxic chemicals including benzene and phthalates; and

WHEREAS, scientific research links toxic chemicals commonly found in beauty products to breast cancer, hormone disruption, respiratory illness, reproductive harm, early puberty, learning disabilities, and other serious health conditions; and

WHEREAS, manufacturers of synthetic braiding hair are not required to disclose product ingredients, leaving consumers unaware of potential long-term health risks associated with routine hair practices; and

WHEREAS, public health experts and consumer advocates have urged the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) to assert regulatory authority over synthetic braiding hair as a cosmetic product; and

WHEREAS, several states, including California, Vermont, Washington, and Oregon, have demonstrated that banning toxic chemicals in cosmetics is both feasible and effective; and

WHEREAS, the Wayne County Commission believes that safer, non-toxic beauty products can and must be achieved while protecting public health, consumer rights, and local economies.

Now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Commission on this 5th day of February, 2026, commits to elevating beauty-related health equity as a public policy issue by advocating for more transparency and consumer safety as it relates to hair and beauty products; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Commission calls for the removal of known carcinogens and toxic chemicals from hair and beauty care products, particularly those disproportionately used by Black and other women of color; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Commission urges the Michigan Legislature and the United States Congress to require full ingredient disclosure and clear labeling for all beauty and hair products, including synthetic braiding hair; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Commission supports and requests that the FDA take regulatory action to formally classify synthetic braiding hair as a cosmetic product subject to safety standards and bans products found to have unsafe toxin levels; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Commission encourages ongoing research and public health data collection related to the potential long-term health risks associated with these products; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Commission encourages salons, retailers, and distributors to promote safer, non-toxic alternatives and to reduce chemical exposure for clients and workers; and be it further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this Resolution be forwarded to the Wayne County Health Department, Detroit Health Department, Mayor of City of Detroit, Detroit City Council, Mayor of Inkster, Mayor of Harper Woods, Mayor of Highland Park, Mayor of Romulus, Mayor of Ecorse, Wayne County Delegation of the Michigan Legislature, Director of the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, Michigan Congressional Delegation, Chair of the Congressional Black Caucus and Commissioner of Food and Drugs.

WHEREAS, the Wayne County Commission has previously approved multiple contracts including corresponding funding sources with JD Edwards account fund code, business unit and object code numbers as reflected in the respective Resolutions for each contract; and

WHEREAS, as the Wayne County Department of Management and Budget began implementing the Oracle Enterprise software beginning in October 2025, which included migrating and updating the referenced JD Edwards account combinations to new Oracle account combinations; and

WHEREAS, the attached Exhibits 1-3 reflect the current mapping of all affected JD Edwards account combinations -- fund code, business unit and object code - - that correlate to the new Oracle account combinations -- fund, cost center code and account code; and

WHEREAS, the Resolutions that were approved with JD Edwards account combinations require amendment to reflect the new corresponding Oracle account combinations to allow for the issuance of purchase orders and payments.

Now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Commission this 5th day of February, 2026 does hereby approve the current mapping of all affected JD Edwards account combinations -- fund code, business unit and object code -- that correlate to the Oracle account combinations -- fund, cost center code and account code -- as set forth in Exhibits 1-3 attached hereto; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Commission authorizes the use of Oracle account combinations for previously approved contracts that included JD Edwards account combinations in their respective Resolutions based on the mapping set forth in the attached Exhibits 1-3; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall only be applicable to contracts received by the Wayne County Commission, through the appropriate submittal platform, on or before February 5, 2026. Contracts received after February 5, 2026, that do not contain the correct Oracle account combination shall be corrected separately; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Wayne County Department of Management and Budget shall submit a report detailing all contracts that utilize mapping as authorized in this Resolution to the Wayne County Commission by June 1, 2026.
