REPORT FROM THE CHAIR

There was no report from the Chair.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

OFFERING OF ALL PETITIONS, ORDINANCES, RESOLUTIONS AND PRESENTATIONS

1. An update on the Criminal Justice Complex.

James Heath, Aaron Wagner, and Victoria Inniss-Edwards provided an update on the Criminal Justice Complex.

*Mr. Heath said that Rock Ventures, LLC (Rock) informed the County that it was close to substantial completion on the Criminal Justice Complex (CJC), and it will notify the County when that happens. At that point, the County will have 10 days to respond with any outstanding issues. Rock sent a "soft statement" on May 1, and the County was reviewing it with its CJC representative, Carter Goble Associates. The County will respond in a week or two and meet with Rock. The final turnover starts the County's six-month move-in window. He said that the transition teams are working diligently, and the transition plan will be shared with the Commission.

*Mr. Heath said that the projected turnover date of May 30 likely would not be met because substantial completion, which comes before the turnover date, has not happened. He said that having part of the six-month move-in window during the winter will not slow the process. He added that discussions with the Clerk's Office about document storage are ongoing, and that a security plan for employees parking off the CJC campus is being formulated. The Sheriff's Office is responsible for security on the CJC campus.

1. Recommending approval of Amendment No. 1 to a contract between the Charter County of Wayne and Baker and Associates (of Dearborn) not to exceed \$34,082.97 for additional hours to oversee and inspect the project related to construction engineering services for 0.94 miles of hot mix asphalt milling and resurfacing of Haggerty Road from the I-94 service drive to Tyler Road in Van Buren Township; Amendment No. 1 increases the total contract not-to-exceed amount from \$232,869.25 to \$266,952.22; per the total contract not-to-exceed amount, Baker and Associates will subcontract 13.76%/\$36,721.05 to Somat Engineering, Inc. (of Detroit) for construction material testing; the term of the contract remains from October 7, 2021 through September 30, 2023; the cost of Amendment No. 1 will be charged to Account No. 201 44908 817000 (Roads-Engineering/Architecture). 2. Recommending approval of a retroactive five-year, comparable-source concession agreement with a five-year option to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and JGK Hospitality, LLC (of Rochester) (successor to Kosch Hospitality, LLC) at a flat fee of 14 percent of gross sales to provide concession operation and management services for the Elizabeth Park Chateau on the River and Tourist Lodge in the City of Trenton; the County Executive advises that 1 proposal was received in response to 174 direct solicitations; after review, the Procurement Division recommended award to Kosch Hospitality, LLC (of Rochester); subsequently, during the contract review stages, the principal owner died and the co-principal created JGK Hospitality, LLC, which then also submitted a proposal; after review, the Procurement Division recommends award to JGK Hospitality, LLC, which was evaluated and determined to have met all bid specifications and was responsive; the term of the contract will commence upon Commission approval for five years; the revenue from the agreement will be deposited into Account No. 208 44925 643020 (Parks-Millage Operating).
