E. New business

The Committee moved items E.1 and 2 together.

1. Killeen/Wilson **Forwarded to Full Board to receive and file.** Communication from the Wayne County Women's Commission, forwarding Resolution No. 2026-001 adopted on March 12, 2026, recognizing the celebration of National Women's History Month as a time to promote fair and equal pay for all women and supporting Michigan Senate Bill 145, which will remove systemic barriers to pay equity. (2026-69-022) Motion Carried.

2. Killeen/Wilson **Approved.** A resolution by Commissioner Bell fully supporting the Wayne County Women's Commission Resolution No. 2026-001 advocating for the adoption of Michigan Senate Bill 145 and encouraging the Women's Commission to continue its efforts to advocate for the wellbeing of all women in Wayne County, especially as it

relates to pay equity. (2026-69-021) Motion Carried.

3. Killeen/Peterson-Mayberry

Approved. Retroactive Amendment No. 2 to a two-year legal services agreement between the Charter County of Wayne and Dickinson Wright, PLLC (of Detroit) not to exceed \$120,000, extending the term, in the matter of Regina Parks v the County of Wayne and Sheriff Raphael Washington (U.S. District Court Case No.: 2:2025-cv-10409); the term is extended through February 20, 2028; the term of the original contract and previous amendment is from February 21, 2025 through February 20, 2027; the total amount is increased from \$145,000 to \$265,000; the cost will be charged to Account No. 10110 351010 8010150 (WCSO County Jail). (2025-40-013M2) Motion Carried.

4. Killeen/Peterson-Mayberry

Approved. Amendment No. 4 to a two-year legal services agreement between the Charter County of Wayne and Dickinson Wright, PLLC (of Detroit) not to exceed \$40,000, extending the term, in the matter of Crystal Perry v the County of Wayne, Donna Wilson and Matthew Carmona (Third Judicial Circuit of Michigan Case No.: 23-012352-CZ); the term is extended through October 12, 2027; the term of the original agreement and previous amendments is from October 13, 2023 through October 12, 2026; the total amount is increased from \$260,000 to \$300,000; the cost will be charged to Account No. 10101 270020 8030010 (PHR Human Resource Administration). (2024-40-005M4) Motion Carried.

There was a discussion about the plaintiff filing an appeal.

5. Killeen/Peterson-Mayberry

Approved. Amendment No. 1 to a two-year legal services agreement between the Charter County of Wayne and Bloom Sluggett, PC (of Grand Rapids) not to exceed \$21,500 in the Wayne County v Strait Trucking, Inc., et al. case (Third Judicial Circuit of Michigan Case No.: 25-006340-ND); the term remains from August 26, 2025 through August 25, 2027; the total amount is increased from \$35,000 to \$56,500; the cost will be charged to Account No. 20101 449070 8030010 (DPS Road Administration). (2025-40-059M1) Motion Carried.

Jim Jernigan provided an overview.

There was a discussion about the underlying agreement not coming to the Commission for its consideration because it was less than the Procurement Ordinance threshold.

7. Killeen/Peterson-Mayberry

Approved. Amendment No. 1 to a two-year cooperative agreement between the Charter County of Wayne and Oracle America, Inc. (of Austin, TX) not to exceed \$600,000, through MiDEAL contract No. 071B4300149, to expand the scope of the Application Management Services for Oracle Fusion, which is the application for Connect43; the Executive's Office advises that this amendment will consolidate services and eliminate the need for the Cloud Service unit credit charges to support cost; the term remains from June 17, 2025 from June 16, 2027; the amount is increased from \$1,412,000 to \$2,012,000; the cost will be charged to Account No. 10110 202080 8170010 (MB Enterprise Resource Planning). (2025-53-041M1) Motion Carried.

Greg Abbas provided an overview.

There was a discussion about the agreement extending beyond the MiDEAL co-op expiration and how it's addressed in the agreement.

6. Killeen/Peterson-Mayberry

Approved. A two-year comparable-source agreement with three, one-year options to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and Savi Solutions PBC (of Washington, D.C.) not to exceed \$1,000,000 to offer employees and residents access to services designed to help student loan borrowers better understand debt, optimize repayment options and address financial needs; the term will commence upon Commission approval for two years; the cost will be charged to Account No. 10110 202010 8170010 (MB Administration). (2026-31-007) Motion Carried.

Donna Wilson and Tony Raffa provided an overview.

There was a discussion about who the program would be available to and how services are being promoted. They also discussed the federal student loan collections restart date and how Savi Solutions educates customers about the best repayment options.
