1. Killeen/Marecki **Approved.** Revision of Resolution No. 2026-191, a 24-month comparable-source contract with one, two-year option to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and Hegira Health, Inc. (of Livonia) not to exceed \$3,223,909 for the implementation and development of a regional, coordinated system for integrated crisis co-response services to address post-overdose, mental health, substance use and/or co-occurring crises within the out-Wayne County region; the term will commence upon Commission approval for 24 months; the cost will be charged to Account Nos. 28401 605620 8170010 (\$2,579,128 Opioid Settlement) and 49910 **614990** 8170010 (\$644,781 **Well Wayne Community Behavioral Health**). (2025-08-006) Motion Carried.

[Note: This resolution (No. 2026-191) was approved by the Wayne County Commission on March 19, 2026. Subsequent to its approval, the Department of Health, Human and Veterans Services requested to modify one of the funding lines to accurately reflect the project funding sources. It is requested that a revised resolution be adopted on July 14, 2026. (The changes are in bold.)]

2. Killeen/Marecki

Approved. Amendment No. 3 to five-year comparable-source contract with two, one-year options to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and eClinicalWorks, LLC (of Westborough, MA), with no change in the dollar amount, extending the term by two years and reallocating funding, to continue providing software license application hosting services for the electronic medical records system utilized by the Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC), also known as the Wayne County Healthy Communities, and the Department of Health, Human & Veterans Services' Public Health and Clinical Care Divisions' clinics; the term is extended through June 30, 2028; the term of the original contract and previous amendments was from July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2026; the total contract not-to-exceed amount remains \$721,758.32; the cost will be charged to Account Nos. 22101 611030 8030010 (-\$40,000 HHVS Fed Qual Health Cent Hamtramck) and 22101 601160 8030010 (\$40,000 HHVS Health Admin). (2019-19-005M3) Motion Carried.

3. Marecki/Killeen

Approved. A one-year clinical outpatient service provider agreement with two, one-year options to renew, at the sole option of the Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network (DWIHN), between the Charter County of Wayne and DWIHN (of Detroit) not to exceed \$5,000,000 to support the provision of mental health services for Wayne County Jail adult inmates; the Executive's office advises that the delivery of mental health services is mandated by Federal law, State statute and other standard of care requirements for inmates in the custody of a local

correctional facility; the term is from October 1, 2025 through September 30, 2026; the revenue will be deposited into Account No. 22101 354030 5810020 (HHVS Jail Mental Health). (2026-19-004) Motion Carried.

4. Discussion with Bridgeway Services, Inc., CCMO-Center for Youth and Families and Vista Maria dba InSight Youth and Family Connections

Tawanna Rogers-Reece of Vista Maria dba Insight Youth and Family Connections provided an overview of the organizations' locations and programs, highlighting efforts to keep youth engaged in education, support youth and families, address behavioral needs, provide educational services, and offer workforce development through initiatives such as the STEPS program and workforce readiness cohorts.

Jerri Fisher of CCMO-Center for Youth and Families provided an overview of the organization's service locations, years of service, and partnerships with Spectrum Human Services and the Ennis Center for Children. She also highlighted the organization's guiding principles, including justice for youth, families, and staff, mercy, humility, and restorative justice.

Amy Rebant of Bridgeway Services, Inc. highlighted the organization's partnerships with The Guidance Center and MiSide to provide mental health and substance use treatment for individuals of all ages, regardless of insurance status or ability to pay. She explained that the partnership connects youth and families to a continuum of evidence-based services while ensuring coordinated support and oversight throughout their involvement in the youth justice system.
