E. New Business

1. Baker McCormick/Killeen **Approved.** Amendment No. 1 to a one-year continuation grant agreement between the Charter County of Wayne and the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Health Resources and Services Administration, in the amount of \$250,000 with no County match, to support the continued operations of the Wayne County Healthy Communities' two Federally Qualified Health Centers, which deliver comprehensive outpatient primary medical care, behavioral health services and dental care to low-income and medically underserved residents of Wayne County in the cities of Hamtramck and Wayne to promote equitable access to high-quality health care throughout the County; the term remains from June 1, 2025 through May 31, 2026; the total amount is increased from \$2,219,539 to \$2,469,539; the revenue will be deposited into Account Nos. 22101 611030 5290000 (\$150,000 HHVS Fed Qual Health Cent Hamtramck) and 22101

611020 5290000 (\$100,000 HHVS Fed Qual Health Cent Wayne). (2025-19-007M1) Motion Carried.

Javar Jackson provided overview. There was a discussion about the increase of hours, sustainability and revenue generation.

2. Marecki/Killeen

Approved. A grant agreement between the Charter County of Wayne and the State of Michigan, Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs, Cannabis Regulatory Agency, in the amount of \$562,581, with no County match, to provide education, communication and outreach services regarding the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act; the term is from January 1, 2026 through September 15, 2026; the revenue will be deposited into Account No. 22101 602030 5690010 (HHVS Medical Marijuana Education). (2026-08-007) Motion Carried.

Dr. Brianna Osorio provided an overview. There was a discussion about programs and service locations.

3. Marecki/Killeen

Approved. A three-year sole-source software-as-a-service (SaaS) agreement between the Charter County of Wayne and Metopio, Inc. (of Chicago, IL) not to exceed \$523,500 for the development and launch of the Wayne County Health Atlas, a dynamic, interactive public health dashboard, to enhance visibility into public health data and access to PolicyMap; the Executive's Office advises that the Health Atlas is a searchable, interactive platform that allows residents, community organizations, researchers and public health stakeholders to easily access, analyze and download health data across various geographies, such as census tracts, neighborhoods, ZIP codes and municipalities within the County, excluding Detroit; it will subcontract 3.4%/\$18,000 to PolicyMap, Inc. (of Philadelphia, PA) to provide three-year access to PolicyMap.com SaaS online data and mapping platform; the term will commence upon Commission approval for three years; the cost will be charged to Account No. 49910 184990 8170010 (well wayne ProjectCommunity). (2026-20-003) Motion Carried.

Azia Harris-Martin provided an overview. There was a discussion about outcome data, understanding trends, public access and community engagement.

4. Killeen/Marecki

Approved. A grant agreement between the Charter County of Wayne and the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services in the amount of \$705,069 to accept funds, through the Local Community Stabilization Authority, in accordance with the State of Michigan Local Community Stabilization Authority Act, MCL 123.1357(4)(viii) to offset costs associated with the delivery of services in the Essential Local Public Health Services programs, including Food Safety and Hearing and Vision; the term is from November 30, 2025 through September 30, 2026; the revenue will be deposited into Account Nos. 22101 372010 5550010 (\$612,069 HHVS Food Inspection) and 22101 601170 5550010 (\$93,000 HHVS Hearing Vision). (2026-08-006) Motion Carried.

5. Discussion with Southwest Counseling Solutions dba MiSide-MiHealth and the City of Westland.

City of Westland representatives discussed program components and services that are provided. Those include case management, life choices, peer groups, parent/guardian support groups, social/life skills events, and sexual education workshops. They also discussed the number of students, case managers, and the number of caseloads per manager in the programs.

Southwest Counseling Solutions representatives discussed the length of stay for youth assistance, and education groups that focus on domestic violence, bullying and healthy relationships. The services also include transportation to and from the center, mentoring services, treatment goals, tutoring support and employment opportunities for youth.
