E. New Business

1. Killeen/Anderson **Approved.** A resolution by Commissioner Scott regarding the environmental impact of the Hercules Materials Holdings, LLC and Crown Enterprises concrete mixing plant (the "Kronos Plant") in the City of Detroit. (2026-66-026) Motion Carried.

Chair Scott provided overview of the resolution, and explained why the plant is harmful and why it should be shut down.

Chair Scott opened up public comments for this item. Comments were provided by Reverend Sharon Buttry, Dr. Mattie Fleming, Kye Lynn, Diana Morris and Allison Bohn.

Communication from Azia Harris-Martin, Chief Programs Officer, Department of Health, Human & Veterans Services, forwarding a status report on Well Wayne initiatives (JustAir, RIP Medical Debt, naloxone vending machines, Vision to Learn, Eastern Market Fresh Trucks Program and the Empowerment Plan – Coats for Hope Program), pursuant to Enrolled Ordinance No. 2025-659, pages 18 and 19, items 11 through 16. (2026-20-011) Motion Carried.

Azia Harris-Martin provided an overview.

There was a discussion about Narcan machine locations and potential places for them to be placed.

Communication from Dr. Brianna Eccleston, Public Health Division Director, Department of Health, Human and Veterans Services, forwarding the report on activities of the Cooperative Extension Services program, comparing the results from Fiscal Year 2023-2024 to Fiscal Year 2024-2025, pursuant to Enrolled Ordinance No. 2025-659, page 18, item 6. (2026-08-010) Motion Carried.

Dr. Brianna Eccleston provided an overview.

There was a discussion regarding the programs being virtual and online and program funding.

Forwarded to Full Board to receive and file. Communication from Charli E. Rose, Director, Medical Examiner's Office, Health, Human & Veterans Services Department, forwarding the "MEO Turnaround Time Analysis" report for the period of January 2026 to March 2026, pursuant to Enrolled Ordinance No. 2025-659, page 18, item 9. (2026-09-003) Motion Carried.

Charli E. Rose provided an overview.

The report explained that over a 90-day period, 4,228 decedents were reported to the MEO office and it accepted jurisdiction of 735 of those cases. 460 received full autopsies, 245 received inspection only and 31 received limited autopsies. 2,391 cases were submitted for histology and the average turnaround time for that service was 3.4 days. Of those 735, the final cause of death was issued in 17 days.

5. Marecki/Killeen

Approved. Amendment No. 2 to a three-year comparable-source contract with two, one-year options to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and Detroit Public Safety Foundation (of Detroit), with no change in the dollar amount, to reallocate the budget to continue providing community-based programming for at-risk youth in Detroit through the Moving Forward Series program; the Executive's Office advises that this contract is 75% funded by the State of Michigan Child Care Fund and 25% funded by the General Fund for youth ages 7-17; per the total contract amount, it will subcontract 10.01%/\$270,000 to Exponential EduVentures, LLC (of Detroit) for a full-time program coordinator, 3.89%/\$105,000 to Diamond Sharpe (of Ann Arbor) for a part-time case manager, 5.95%/\$160,500 to Andrew Rainey (of Detroit) for a part-time case manager, 3.89%/\$105,000 to Malinda Williams (of Westland) for a part-time case manager, 2.78%/\$75,000 to Pierre Knight (of Detroit) for a part-time youth advocate, 2.78%/\$75,000 to Tyikesha Ashford (of Detroit) for a part-time youth advocate, 2.78%/\$75,000 to Raymond E. Hall II (of Detroit) for a part-time youth advocate, 2.78%/\$75,000 to Shalonda Wells (of Detroit) for a part-time youth advocate and 6.67%/\$180,000 to Regeneration Transportation (of Detroit) for transportation for a portion of the youth; the term remains from July 18, 2024 through July 17, 2027; the total not-to-exceed amount remains \$2,697,390; the cost will continue to be charged to Account No. 29201 356360 8170010 (JYS Prevention and Diversion). (2024-06-013M2) Motion Carried.

6. Anderson/Marecki

Approved. Amendment No. 5 to a classroom use license and service provider agreement with a one-year option to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and Infinity Institute of Learning, formerly Capstone Academy Charter School (of Detroit), with no change in the dollar amount, extending the term, to continue to provide educational programming for residents at the Juvenile Detention Facility; it will subcontract to Infinite Pathways, LLC (of Detroit) as the educational service provider for daily operations; the total amount remains \$1, with no County match required; the term is extended through June 30, 2027; the term of the original agreement and previous amendments is from July 1, 2017 through June 30, 2026; the revenue will be deposited into Account No. 29201 356010 8030010 (HHVS JDF Operations). (2017-20-095M5) Motion Carried.
