1. Killeen/Marecki **Approved.** A retroactive no-money memorandum of agreement between the Charter County of Wayne and Henry Ford Hospital formalizing the hospital's role in providing outpatient drugs to indigent and low-income Wayne County citizens under the United States Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Pharmacy Affairs, 340B Program; the Executive's Office advises that the program requires participating health care organizations to provide supporting documentation from local government allowing for such assistance to indigent and low-income individuals who are not covered under Medicaid or Medicare, for little or no reimbursement, regardless of the individual's ability to pay; the term is from September 1, 2025 through August 31, 2030. (2026-08-011) Motion Carried.

2. Killeen/Anderson

Approved. A retroactive comparable-source professional services contract with a five-year option to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and Oakwood Healthcare, Inc. dba Corewell Health (of Southfield) not to exceed \$2,009,129 for outpatient tuberculosis clinical services to residents of out-Wayne County; the term is from April 1, 2026 through September 30, 2030; the cost will be charged to Account Nos. 22101 605090 8010080 (\$1,796,867 HHVS Respiratory Diseases) and 22101 605090 7630010 (\$212,262 HHVS Respiratory Diseases). (2026-08-008) Motion Carried.

3. Marecki/Killeen

Approved. Amendment No. 4 to a four-year memorandum of understanding (MOU) between the Charter County of Wayne, acting through the Department of Juvenile and Youth Services, and the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office not to exceed \$475,236, extending the term, to continue the Right TRAC (Taking Responsibility and Accepting Consequences) Diversion program at the Third Judicial Circuit of Michigan, Juvenile Division, for Fiscal Year 2027; the term is extended through September 30, 2027; the term of the original MOU and previous amendments is from October 1, 2019 through September 30, 2026; the total amount is increased from \$3,239,570.13 to \$3,714,806.13; the cost will be charged to Account No. 29201 356360 8310140 (JYS Prevention and Diversion). (2019-06-005M4) Motion Carried.

There was a discussion regarding recidivism rates and additional money being added to the contract.

4. Killeen/Anderson

Approved. Amendment No. 2 to a three year grant agreement with up to one, two-year option to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and the City of Wayne not to exceed \$1,050,000, exercising one year of the renewal, to amend the scope to reflect the State of Michigan's change in eligibility for Child Care Fund services and continue to provide prevention services for at-risk youth through the First Contact program; the Executive's Office advises the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services – Child Care Fund has changed the age of eligibility to 10 years to under 18 years old; the term is from June 1, 2026 through May 31, 2027; the term of the original agreement and previous amendment was from June 1, 2023 through May 31, 2026; the total amount is increased from \$3,150,000 to \$4,200,000; the revenue will be deposited into Account Nos. 29201 356360 5400020 (\$787,500 JYS Prevention and Diversion) and 29201 356360 5890010 (\$262,500 JYS Prevention and Diversion); the cost will be charged to Account No. 29201 356360 8470000 (\$1,050,000 JYS Prevention and Diversion). (2023-06-009M2) Motion Carried.

Rachael Davis and Porsche Carlisle provided an overview.

There was discussion regarding the eligibility age change being from 10-18 to 10-17 years old and housing of older youth vs younger youth and how they are separated. Youth are separated based on gender, age groups and type of offenses.

5. Baker McCormick/Killeen

Approved. Amendment No. 2 to a three-year grant agreement with up to one, two-year option to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and the City of Garden City not to exceed \$1,812,500, exercising one year of the renewal, to amend the scope to reflect the State of Michigan's change in eligibility for Child Care Fund services and continue to provide prevention services for at-risk youth through the First Contact program; the Executive's Office advises the

Michigan Department of Health and Human Services – Child Care Fund has changed the age of eligibility to 10 years to under 18 years old; the term is from June 1, 2026 through May 31, 2027; the term of the original agreement and previous amendment was from June 1, 2023 through May 31, 2026; the total amount is increased from \$5,437,500 to \$7,250,000; the revenue will be deposited into Account Nos. 29201 356360 5400020 (\$1,359,375 JYS Prevention and Diversion) and 29201 356360 5890010 (\$453,125 JYS Prevention and Diversion); the cost will be charged to Account No. 29201 356360 8470000 (\$1,812,500 JYS Prevention and Diversion). (2023-06-008M2) Motion Carried.

It also focuses on making sure parents are involved. She discussed the number of youth in programs, statistics and retention rates and locations
