E. New Business

1. Killeen/Anderson **Approved.** A subgrant agreement between the Charter County of Wayne and Metro Solutions, Inc. (of Southfield) not to exceed \$83,333, with no County match required, for a Michigan Department of Health and Human Services 2026 Regional Perinatal Quality Collaborative Grant to improve the efficiency and impact of maternal and infant health programs; the term will commence upon Commission approval through September 30, 2026; the revenue will be deposited into Account No. 28710 602090 5810010 (HHVS SEMPQUIC). (2026-20-012) Motion Carried.

Azia Harris-Martin provided an overview.

There was a discussion regarding daily updates on the RX Kids website. There was further discussion regarding the number of families and babies enrolled

in the program and the communities served. Committee members inquired about whether doula services were provided/covered within the Federally Qualified Health Centers.

2. Anderson/Killeen

Approved. Amendment No. 2 to a three-year grant agreement with up to one, two-year option to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and the Student Advocacy Center of Michigan (of Ypsilanti) not to exceed \$468,519, exercising one year of the renewal, to amend the scope to reflect the State of Michigan's change in eligibility for Child Care Fund services and continue to provide prevention services for at-risk youth through the First Contact program; the term is from July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027; the term of the original agreement and previous amendment was from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2026; the total amount is increased from \$1,405,557 to \$1,874,076; the revenue will be deposited into Account Nos. 29201 356360 5400020 (\$351,389 JYS Prevention and Diversion) and 29201 356360 5890010 (\$117,130 JYS Prevention and Diversion); the cost will be charged to Account No. 29201 356360 8470000 (\$468,519 JYS Prevention and Diversion). (2023-06-012M2) Motion Carried.

3. Anderson/Killeen

Approved. Amendment No. 2 to a three-year grant agreement with up to one, two-year option to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and United Way for Southeastern Michigan (of Detroit) not to exceed \$4,242,400, exercising one year of the renewal, to amend the scope to reflect the State of Michigan's change in eligibility for Child Care Fund services and continue to provide prevention services for at-risk youth through the First Contact program; per the amendment amount, it will subcontract 0.5%/\$20,988 to Alternatives for Girls (of Detroit) for after-school programming and youth development, 7.4%/\$313,948 to Bint Jebail Cultural Center (of Dearborn) for after-school programming and conflict resolution, 1.7%/\$73,381 to Centers for Family Development (of Detroit) for family and individual counseling, 2.1%/\$87,772 to Cody Rouge Community Action Alliance (of Detroit) for after-school programming and career development, 4.2%/\$177,095 to the Detroit Association of Black

Organizations (of Detroit) for group counseling and life skills, 21.9%/\$931,155 to Diversified Community Services (of Detroit) for after-school programming and social skills enhancement, 3.8%/\$160,592 to Detroit Public Safety Foundation (of Detroit) for after-school programming and school-based truancy intervention, 22.9%/\$972,357 to Franklin Wright Settlements, Inc. (of Detroit) for after-school programming and tutoring/academic enrichment, 7.6%/\$323,744 to Healthy Kidz, Inc. (of Detroit) for after-school programming and anti-bullying intervention, 1.2%/\$52,873 to Journey to Healing (of Detroit) for family and group counseling, 17.5%/\$744,247 to Matrix Human Services (of Detroit) for after-school programming and tutoring/academic enrichment and 9.1%/\$384,248 to The Yunion (of Detroit) for group and individual counseling; the term is from July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027; the term of the original agreement and previous amendment was from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2026; the total amount is increased from \$12,727,200 to \$16,969,600; the revenue will be deposited into Account Nos. 29201 356360 5400020 (\$3,181,800 JYS Prevention and Diversion) and 29201 356360 5890010 (\$1,060,600 JYS Prevention and Diversion); the cost will be charged to Account No. 29201 356360 8470000 (\$4,242,400 JYS Prevention and Diversion). (2023-06-010M2) Motion Carried.

4. Anderson/Killeen

Approved. Retroactive Amendment No. 2 to a three-year grant agreement with up to one, two-year option to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and the City of Westland not to exceed \$1,300,000, exercising one year of the renewal, to amend the scope to reflect the State of Michigan's change in eligibility for Child Care Fund services and continue to provide prevention services for at-risk youth through the First Contact program; the term is from July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2027; the term of the original agreement and previous amendment is from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2026; the total amount is increased from \$3,900,000 to \$5,200,000; the revenue will be deposited into Account Nos. 29201 356360 5400020 (\$975,000 JYS Prevention and Diversion) and 29201 356360 5890010 (\$325,000 JYS Prevention and Diversion); the cost will be charged to Account No. 29201 356360 8470000 (\$1,300,000 JYS Prevention and Diversion). (2023-06-013M2) Motion Carried.

Porsche Carlyle, Rachael Davis, Paul Motz, Jaley Warren, and Steven Smith provided an overview.

There was a discussion regarding the eligibility age changing from 7-17 to 10-17. There was further discussion regarding overspending.
