AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND SUBSECTION 129.321 OF THE WAYNE COUNTY CODE OF ORDINANCES TO AMEND THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT FEES FOR THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SERVICES, ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES GROUP.

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE CHARTER COUNTY OF WAYNE:

SECTION 1. SUBSECTION 129.321 OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES AMENDED

Subsection 129.321 of the Wayne County Code of Ordinances is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 129-321. Department of Public Services, Environmental Services Group fees established.

The fees for services provided by the Department of Public Services, Environmental Services Group are established as follows, effective July 1, 1993:

- (1) Well and/or septic system investigation, \$150.00.
- (2) Sewage disposal system permit:

- (3) Each significant industrial user, as defined by the Wayne County Sewer Use Ordinance, Enrolled Ordinance No. 98-473, effective August 6, 1998, must pay an annual industrial surveillance fee. That fee shall be paid pursuant to the formula below:

Industrial Surveillance Fee = Administrative Fee + Monitoring Costs

Administrative Fee = A + B + C

A = Base industrial surveillance fee (\$1,300.00 for categorical dischargers/\$700.00 for non-categorical dischargers)

B = Analysis review fee (\$10.00 for each analysis required/yr.)

C = Additional sampling point fee (If more than one sampling point, user will be charged as follows for each additional point: \$300.00 for categorical dischargers/\$200.00 for non-categorical dischargers.)

Monitoring Fee = D × E

D = Number of analyses required under significant industrial user's permit for each parameter for each year

E = Cost of analysis as determined by Wayne County based on a survey of local laboratories

- (4) Non-residential user surcharge, \$204.52 per million gallons of metered water consumption, for all non-residential users to fund the federally mandated industrial pretreatment program.
- (5) Wastewater exemption fees, initial fee of \$300.00 with annual renewal fee of \$200.00.
- (6) Review, analyze, and inspect wastewater transport, treatment and disposal facilities in accordance with the Wayne County Sewer Use Ordinance and Part 41 of Michigan P.A. 451 of 1994:

Footnotes:

- 1 The need for a flow analysis and inspection will be determined during the plan review process.
- 2 "Wayne County System" refers to Wayne County owned or operated wastewater transport, treatment, and disposal facilities.
- 3 Sanitary sewer structures include, but are not limited to, manholes, junction chambers, regulators, equalization basins, combined sewer overflow retention treatment basins, siphons, and pump stations.

- (7) Bi-annual permit to import solid waste, \$250.00 annual standard processing fee plus \$50.00 for every out-of-county source; applicable to Type II and Type III landfills and transfer stations.

(8) Facility siting review fee, up to \$20,000.00 for each new solid waste landfill, processing or transfer facility applying for inclusion into the Wayne County Solid Waste Management Plan.

(9) Soil erosion and sedimentation control review, permit and inspection:

(10) Water supply permit:

a. One or two family unit, \$75.00, or

- b. Other than one or two family unit, \$200.00.
- (11) Solid waste programs, planning and administrative service (including County Solid Waste Plan implementation per Part 115 of P.A. 451 of 1994) fees to be assessed operators of landfills:
- a. Solid waste disposed in Type II landfills, 16 cents per cubic yard or 48 cents per ton.
 - 1. Only solid waste disposed of in Type II municipal waste landfills is subject to this fee.
 - 2. Payments are to be made quarterly based on gate receipts and submitted concurrent with solid waste reports required by the Wayne County Solid Waste Ordinance.
 - 3. Gate receipts or similar records of the solid waste landfills shall be made available, upon request, for review by representatives of the Department of Environment or Land Resource Management Division.
 - b. The owner or operator of a landfill who is required to pay the surcharge under subsection (6) may pass through and collect the surcharge from any person who generated the solid waste or who arranged for its delivery to the solid waste hauler or transfer facility notwithstanding the provisions of any contract or agreement to the contrary or the absence of any contract or agreement.
- (12) Excess pollutant surcharges:
- a. Sewage system users who discharge wastewater containing excess compatible pollutants may be assessed a surcharge to recover the additional costs incurred for treating those excess compatible pollutants. The threshold concentrations for BOD, TSS, and P are as follow:
 - 1. Biochemical oxygen demand (BOD) - 275 mg/l
 - 2. Total suspended solids (TSS) - 350 mg/l
 - 3. Phosphorus, total as P (P) - 12 mg/l
 - b. These surcharges shall be calculated and assessed in accordance with the surcharge policy as approved by the county agency. Such surcharges shall be credited to the appropriate treatment facilities operation fund. The surcharge rates per pound of pollutant are as follows:
 - 1. BOD - \$0.271/lb
 - 2. TSS - \$0.203/lb

3. P - \$2.105/lb
