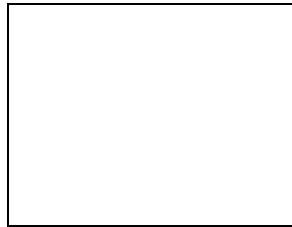


Thank you for participating in the Michigan Department of Community Health (MDCH) Children's Special Health Care Services (CSHCS) Program.
