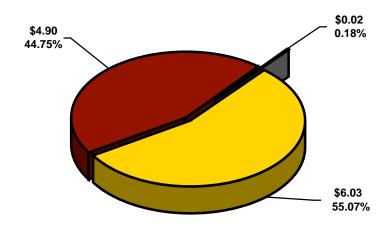

The recording requirements are set by State statute and must be adhered to when a document is submitted for recording. The Indexers for the Register of Deeds us specialized equipment which allows them to pull up documents on one screen and the second screen has the standardized form for their completion and verification of all information located on the document that is required to be entered into the land records system for purposes of search and retrieval.

EXPENDITURE ANALYSIS FISCAL YEAR 2008-2009 \$10.95 (in millions)

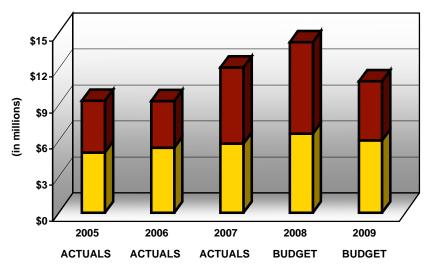


PERSONNEL

■OTHER EXPENDITURES

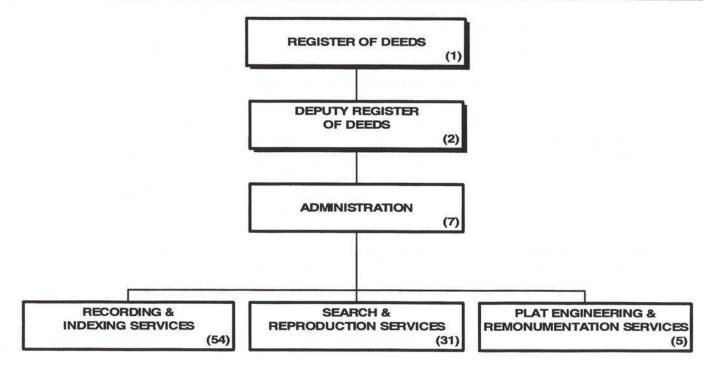

REGISTER OF DEEDS Major Activities and Descriptions

ADMINISTRATION: Provide overall department management, direction and supervision. Formulate and notify staff as well as public of policy changes and legal requirements. Develops and administers budget for department and maintains adequate resources to provide proper service levels. Sets policies and regulations concerning the use of facilities and records.

RECORDING AND INDEXING SERVICES: The Register of Deeds is the only county officer authorized by state law to record, index and maintain land records. The Wayne County Register of Deeds office records up to three-quarter of a million documents a year, including deeds, mortgages, assignments, discharges and construction liens. In addition to reviewing, processing and imaging each document recorded, the Register of Deeds Office creates a variety of indexes to find each document and detailed abstract describing the most significant information contained in each document.

SEARCH AND REPRODUCTION SERVICES: The Wayne County Register of Deeds provides customized search services to the general public, to more than 150 commercial customers (title companies, banks, law offices, etc), and scores of government agencies on a daily basis. Access is

provided to more than 50 million document images and abstracts of records maintained through our computerized database, tract index and/or grantorgrantee files.

The use of the Internet has become the greatest significant change of search methods in the Register of Deeds' history. Over three million visitors have researched the data base records since its on-line availability in January 2001. Seventy-seven percent of those searches were done by name only. Information can also be retrieved by address, legal description and document registration number. PLAT ENGINEERING AND REMONUMENTATION:

The Plat Engineering unit of the Wayne County Register of Deeds office reviews more than 75 plats of new subdivisions, condominium master plans, and amendments each year to assure compliance with state survey and land division requirements. The Chief Plat Engineer also serves as the Remonumentation Survey Administrator and as advisor to the Wayne County Plat Board, which is chaired by the Register of Deeds.

FISCAL YEAR 2007-2008 ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND HIGHLIGHTS:

The Register of Deeds eliminated any recording backlog by providing immediate response time for the recording of documents brought into the office that comply with all recording requirements. For those documents received by mail or through a title company, the original recorded document is returned to the submitter within 48 hours.

Created the nation's first fraud unit, along with the Wayne County Sheriff and Prosecutor, which specializes in property research, investigation and prosecution. This unit has set up over 350 case files of suspected fraudulent activity and has a 100% success rate in prosecution, ultimately being

responsible for returning many homes to the rightful owner.

Through the State's Remonumentation program, the Register of Deed's Office began the yearly installation of five Continuous Operating Reference (COR) Stations throughout Wayne County. The COR Stations are highly accurate Global Positioning Systems (GPS) receivers that collect positional data every second from satellites. The density and availability of these receivers make surveying, data collection for mapping and location tracking in Wayne County amongst the best in the United States.
