Monday, July 22, 2013

Taylor Homicide - We have recently received a warrant from the Taylor Police Department regarding a domestic violence homicide that occurred on Friday, July 19, 2013. You will be updated when the review process has been completed.

South Lyon Man Charged in Fatal Stabbing of Taylor Woman

Prosecutor Kym L. Worthy has charged Eric John Frederickson, 31 (DOB 6/18/82), in connection with the July 19, 2013 fatal stabbing of Summer Faulkner, 22, of Taylor. The homicide took place at Ms. Faulkner's residence located in the 23000 block of Rosewood at approximately 10:30 p.m. Frederickson was the former boyfriend of the victim when it is alleged that he entered her apartment without permission and stabbed her around the head and neck area. The victim was pronounced dead at the scene from her wounds.

Frederickson has been charged with First Degree Murder and is expected to be arraigned in 23rd District Court in Taylor as early as 2:30 p.m. today. Please confirm the arraignment time with the court.

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Wednesday, July 24, 2013

Joseph Weekley - DPD officer charged with Manslaughter in connection with the death of Aiyana Stanley-Jones. He will have a pre-trial conference before Cynthia Hathaway on Thursday, July 25, 2013.

Allison Howard - Photographer who pled no contest to Obstruction of Justice for withholding video footage that was crucial to the Aiyana Stanley –Jones homicide investigation. She will have a sentencing hearing tomorrow before Judge Cynthia Hathaway.

The Weekly and Howard hearings are scheduled for 9:00 a.m. tomorrow.

Thursday, July 25, 2013

Joseph Weekley - DPD officer charged with Manslaughter in connection with the death of Aiyana Stanley-Jones. The next court date is on August 21, 2013, before Cynthia Gray Hathaway.

Allison Howard - Photographer who pleaded no contest to Obstruction of Justice for withholding video footage that was crucial to the Aiyana Stanley –Jones homicide investigation. She was sentenced to 24 months of probation, a fine of \$2,000 and up to 200 hours of community service. Howard will complete the terms of her probation in her home state of Massachusetts.

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
