Defense Attorney and Client Convicted by Jury in Perjury Case

On March 19, 2012, attorney David Benjamin Dunn, 44, (DOB: 1/27/1969) was representing Andre Demetrius Collins, 24, (DOB: 1/28/1989) on First Degree Murder charges when he and his client were charged on the first day of trial by the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office with conspiring to get a witness to commit perjury. Today, Dunn and co-defendant Collins were convicted of Conspiracy to Commit Perjury in a Court Proceeding. Dunn was also convicted of Inciting or Procuring Perjury in a Court Proceeding. Both charges carry any term of years up to life in prison. The jury began deliberating on Friday, November 1, 2013 and rendered a verdict this afternoon before Judge Margaret Van Houten. Both defendants will be sentenced on November 18, 2013 at 9:00 a.m.

Renisha McBride Fatal Shooting Death – On Wednesday, November 6, 2013, the Wayne County Prosecutor's Office returned a warrant request to the Dearborn Heights Police Department. We have asked that further investigation be conducted by the police in this case. We will not be able to make a charging decision until the requested work has been completed. Ms. McBride's parents have been informed of our position.
