1. Peterson-Mayberry/Wilson **Forwarded to Full Board to receive and file.**
Communication from Venita A. Terry, Sheriff's
Office Chief of Administration, forwarding a
report on developing a detailed plan to reduce
overtime in the jail and Sheriff's Office, pursuant
to Enrolled Ordinance No. 2025-659, page 15,
item 8. (2026-69-045) Motion Carried.

Venita Terry provided an overview.

There was a discussion about the number of
certified and uncertified officers, the need to
address officer pay and pension multipliers, and
collective bargaining agreement issues. There
was also a discussion about Oakland County
distinctions between certified officers and jailers
and public outreach recruiting efforts.

2. Wilson/Peterson-Mayberry

Approved. A cooperative purchase order between the Charter County of Wayne and Gorno Ford, Inc. (of Woodhaven) in the amount of \$592,642, through the Michigan Department of Technology, Management, and Budget (MiDEAL) contract No. MA240000001193, to purchase six 2026 Ford Explorers and two 2026 Ford F-250s; it will subcontract 26.6%/\$157,440 to Canfield Equipment Service, Inc. (of Warren) for police equipment upfits; the term will commence upon Commission approval through September 30, 2026; the cost will be charged to Account No. 40101 902130 9710060 (NoDpt Sheriff Jail Capital Projects). (2026-71-011) Motion Carried.

Venita Terry provided an overview.

There was a discussion about life expectancy of vehicles, vehicle auctions being handled through the Department of Public Services and vehicles that are issued to reserve officers.

3. Wilson/Peterson-Mayberry

Ratified. A one-year community corrections plan and application between the Charter County of Wayne and the Michigan Department of Corrections, Office of Community Corrections, in the amount of \$900,000, with no County match, for comprehensive plans and services for Fiscal Year 2027 to support approximately 3,000 sentenced County offenders, including jail-based cognitive behavioral therapy, domestic violence prevention treatment, women's trauma-informed care, and violence prevention and intervention programming; the term is from October 1, 2026 through September 30, 2027; the revenue will be deposited into Account No. 28101 354010 5430010 (HHVS Community Corrections). (2026-19-005) Motion Carried.

4. Peterson-Mayberry/Wilson

Approved. Retroactive Amendment No. 2 to a three-year professional services contract with a two-year option to renew between the Charter County of Wayne and Lakeridge Village, Inc. (of Detroit) not to exceed \$375,000 to continue providing a jail-based treatment readiness program for adult males in the County Jail; the term remains from November 3, 2022 through November 2, 2027; the total amount is increased from \$313,300 to \$688,300; the cost will be charged to Account No. 28101 354010 8170010 (HHVS Community Corrections). (2022-19-010M2) Motion Carried.

5. A presentation by Prosecutor Kym Worthy on wellness and recruitment

Prosecutor Kym Worthy began the presentation. Maria Miller spoke about the Prosecutor's Office "Be the Next Prosecutor" recruiting campaign aimed at experienced attorneys through Hadrout Design and Technologies. A television commercial that's part of the campaign was shown.

There was a discussion about agreements with other state bar associations and other County elected offices and department's using Hadrout's services.

Ms. Worthy and Patricia Little spoke about wellness efforts, including teaming with the Detroit Police Department, and the related funding issues. There was a discussion among Commissioners with Ms. Worthy and Felicia Johnson about Oakland and Macomb counties allowing for funding of wellness items, the need for those items due to what prosecutors deal with, the Office of Commission Counsel speaking with the Office of Corporation Counsel about the matter and Prosecutor's Office staff feedback about issues that should be addressed.
